# THE GOOD SAMARITAN



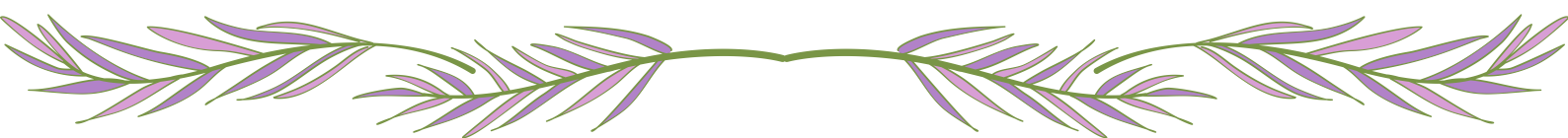

## DORCAS PROJECT

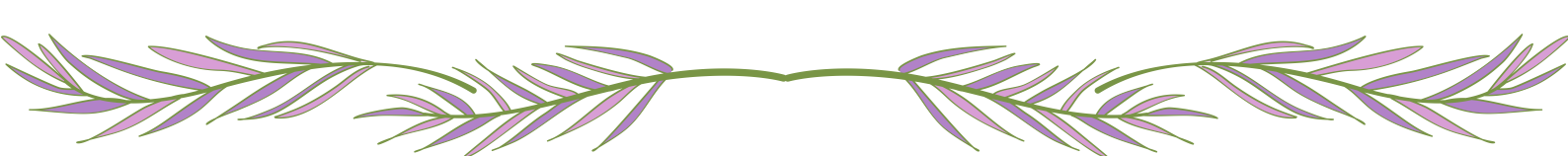

# Training Course

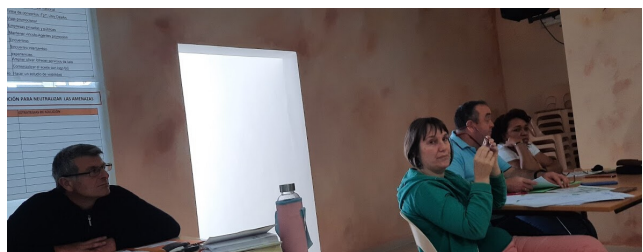
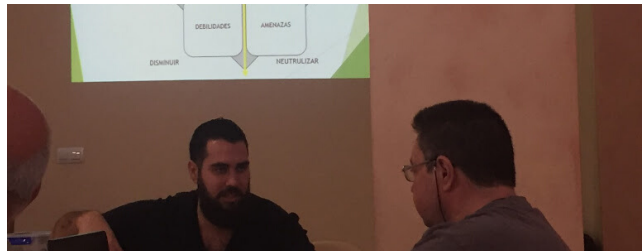
There are 53 people enrolled in the current training course, “Addiction Prevention for Agents of Social Mediation.” It is a two-month-long online course that seeks to train both professionals and volunteers as agents of prevention. In cooperation with the “Cities Against Drugs” platform, the Pozoblanco government and the anti-tobacco program of the Pozoblanco hospital, we prepared 8 modules that cover diverse topics, starting with the basics about addictions and how to relate to those involved, and moving on to emotional intelligence and the network of support for the recovery process. Delyth Sutton is our association’s delegate involved with this program, and one of the teachers of the course. Addiction prevention is everyone’s job, and through this training we are preparing people who can influence their professional and personal environments.





# SWOT Analysis of the Association

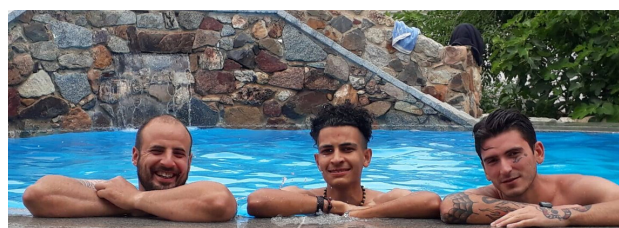

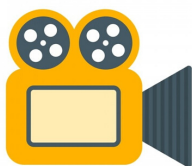


# Fundraising Campaign
